## Important Information for Students Who Will Work at Georgetown This Year

If you will work at Georgetown University this academic year please note the following important information about our Human Resources/Payroll System:

## LOGIN TO GEORGETOWN MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (GMS)

If you are hired by the University you can use your Georgetown NET ID and password to login to the Georgetown Management System (GMS). If you need help logging in to GMS call the University Information Services (UIS) Helpdesk at 7-4949 or send email to help@georgetown.edu.

#### GMS SELF-SERVICE OPTIONS FOR HIRED STUDENTS

- 1. <u>YOUR CONTACT INFORMATION</u>: after your hire has been approved in GMS you can login to GMS to view and revise your personal information including your email and phone contacts.
- 2. <u>FEDERAL TAX EXEMPTION & WITHHOLDING ELECTIONS</u>: as soon as possible after your hire has been approved in GMS you should login to GMS to elect your desired federal tax exemption or withholding status so that the maximum federal taxes are not withheld from your paychecks. Please note that the current version of GMS does not support electronic election of state tax exemptions and withholding; you must make your state tax elections by completing a form and delivering it to the GU Payroll Services office by their published deadlines. You can download state tax forms from the Student Employment website HoyaWorks! <u>https://seo.georgetown.edu/</u>.
- 3. <u>DIRECT DEPOSIT YOUR PAYCHECKS</u>: after your hire has been approved in GMS you can login to GMS to elect to have your paychecks direct deposited to your bank account.
- 4. <u>VIEW YOUR PAYCHECK STUBS</u>: you can login to GMS to find out how much you were paid and when you were paid, whether you are paid by direct deposit or by check.

## INFORMATION YOU SHOULD HAVE READY TO GIVE TO YOUR EMPLOYER AT HIRE

- Your Social Security Number
- Your GUID number, e.g. 8xxxxxx
- Your GU NETID, e.g. ABC12
- Original documents to prove your identity and your eligibility to work. Examples of documents that will satisfy the verification requirements include (1) a passport, or (2) both a driver's license and a birth certificate, or (3) both a social security card and a driver's license. You must present the original documents; copies cannot be accepted.
